But this was not a forever farewell. Tevita heads home to put his own family's health needs first - a priority we can all understand, especially when duty calls from your home country.




OUR HAUORA HUB - PHASE 2

Prior to commencement of Mahi on the whenua, the whanau of Matawhaanui gathered to whakatau our friends from Thorburn Builders and set them on their way by way of Mihi and Karakia. Integral to our way of doing things, our korowai of manaaki to their workers is an extension of the relationship this company have with Te Wharekura o Rakaumanga demonstrating that we are all inter-connected.

From the initial outset, General Manager Joyce Maipi advocated that the project be inclusive of our local talent pool within whanau, marae and Haapori. It didn't make sense to us that the delivery of this building exclude the skillset of those who live in the heart of our community. Drawing on the experience of home-grown tradies and buy in, we can rightfully say, we are invested in the delivery and narratives of our Hauora Hub
